

NOMCOM REQUIREMENTS FROM THE ALAC 2018

Background knowledge

- Desirable links to the technical community or some knowledge of the Internet, Internet Governance and the DNS system
- Recognised volunteer/community work, preferably on Internet related activities
- Desirable knowledge of ICANN – the SO/AC structures, outreach programmes (Fellowships, etc), the way At-Large is organised and works
- Desirable knowledge of Policy Development (ICANN policies, RIR Policies, perhaps even some knowledge of governmental or non-governmental policies or laws)
- Managerial background would support the creation of strategies and efficient operational structure and mechanisms

Personal background and skills

- Ability to work extra hours, attend conference calls at odd hours with access to a reasonable/good internet connection
- Travel 3 times a year, and spend a week on this travel working
- Have a current passport, and ability to get a visa to most countries (at least the ones for the forthcoming meetings)
- Have at least mid-to-good level of English
- A team player and an adherent of ICANN's multistakeholder model
- Willingness to actively contribute to collaborative ALAC team efforts in policy, outreach and organisational activities
- Ability to chair and manage At-Large working groups as well as participate as an ALAC member in cross-community working groups with other constituencies
- Ability to transfer technical knowledge into plain English policy and capacity building content to help to build regional knowledge and skills

Specific Regional recommendations

- Diversity within the regions is desirable, if at all possible, especially where there has been a representative gap either currently or in the past.
- Someone with both technical as well as academic background to contribute to the development of resource material to support capacity building within At-Large especially related to combined technical and policy knowledge
