



How important is the issue of climate change to your vote?


Percentage of respondents who said climate change is important to their vote:














Do you favor or oppose the government taking steps to reduce emissions of gases like carbon dioxide and methane emissions that cause global climate change?

Methodology: Public Opinion Strategies completed the online survey of 1,000 likely voters nationwide. The survey was conducted October 5-8, 2020, with a confidence interval of +3.53%.
