### Texas: #1 in Economic Climate

- CNBC Best State For Business 2018
- Chief Executive Magazine "Best State For Business" for 2018 14th year in a row 1<sup>st</sup> in Economic Climate
- \$1.7 Trillion Texas economy is second biggest in the US
- 100 of the 1,000 largest public and private companies in the U.S. are based in Texas
- Added 350,000 jobs in the past year, 1 in 7 jobs created in the United States in the past year was created in Texas.
- Texas handles roughly \$2 trillion worth of commodities per year with Dallas Fort-Worth International airport playing key roles, the Lone Star State's ability to handle this mass influx of goods makes it the best state in the nation for infrastructure.



### DFW Land Use Plan


DFW's Land Use Plan provides a framework and development strategy for the commercial uses of Airport property




### Cargo and logistics matter to DFW Airport and North Texas

(total economic impact = US\$37 billion)








## Cargo business priorities
