## THE DISTRICT

Located in the seat of Skagit County, 60 miles north of Seattle, the Mount Vernon School District is a growing and diverse district that serves close to 7,000 students. Six elementary schools provide educational programs for students through grade 5. Two middle schools serve students in Grades 6-8.

Mount Vernon High School, home of the Bulldogs, houses students in Grades 9-12. Mount Vernon High School is a sophisticated blend of historical and modern buildings that house excellent and diverse educators, course offerings and students. Athletes from all over the state travel here to compete and showcase their talent in the legendary Mount Vernon High School gym which has been ranked as one of the best gyms in Washington State.

A parent partnership program serves approximately 300 students. The district is the fiscal agent for the Northwest Career & Technical Academy, that serves students from Skagit and Whatcom Counties. With over 900 teachers, administrators and support staff, the district is the third largest employer in Skagit County.

The district is committed to success for all students and provides a wide range of high-quality instructional programs and extended learning opportunities. Academic instruction includes remedial and specially designed instruction for students with special needs, diverse enrichment programs for students, and advanced placement courses across a variety of subjects at the high school level. The schools also provide strong instrumental and vocal music programs.

The Mount Vernon School District has over 100 years of rich history and is the largest district in Skagit County.

Mount Vernon is home to Skagit Valley College; a two-year community college that grants academic transfer degrees, technical degrees and certificates, and Bachelor of Applied Science programs.

Bond funds have already built a new elementary and replaced an outdated elementary school. District advisory committees and school site councils include parents and other community members in setting the direction for the district and our schools.
